SCHOOL BOARD UPDATE - Jay Nash

The school board just had a meeting on Dec 11, 2018. The budget season is finishing up on the 17th. The fixed tax numbers will be out next week and the final numbers will be out the following monday.

The school board is looking into adding 6-7 new program of studies at the highschool. Some classes that may be added are more humanities, art, and computer science. High school students have asked for a current events class.

While a lot of work has been done to get a RAL late bus up and going. But this concept will not be continued. The cost is high and the timing does not work. This could be reconsidered in the future.

Bedford graduation date is June 8, 2019.

Also the school board supports schools having external cameras. A grant can cover 80% of the cost and the school board placed in the extra cost into the budget this year. Internal cameras are not on the agenda at this point.

SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE - Mike Fournier

Mike waited to send out his monthly update till after this school board meeting since many items were discussed.

The LED sign will be ordered and once the order is placed the town may provide recommendations on illumination, graphics etc. Once it is ordered it will take 8-12 weeks Bus drivers are needed! A possibility is to have the lunch/recess monitors learn how to drive the small bus if they would like to.

McKelvie:

PTG—McKelvie Liaison Report 12/6/2018

- The Move-A-Thon was a huge success. McKelvie is donating \$3400 from the proceeds to the PTG. However, there is a strong possibility of more money being donated to the Move-A-Thon through a grant in the name of a deceased Bedford Relative. There is a possibility of \$10-15 per participant being donated. If so, there will be more money donated to the PTG from the Move-A-Thon.
- Update on the Courtyard/playground upgrades. Plans are moving forward to use Move-A-Thon funds for a pavilion, to be built on the playground where the tetherball field was. Plans are still being ironed out for the courtyard. It will cost 30K for simple upgrades with minimal landscape, picnic tables and large checker/chess board. We will use AIR funds to add an artistic piece to the plans for the courtyard.
- McKelvie continues to work on anti-bullying initiatives. They are planning on using the Choose Loves program which includes lessons for the classroom. It is a program started by the mother of Jesse Lewis who was one of the victims of Sandy Hook.

- Mrs. Asdot brought up the idea for the community program. She thought it would be great to offer a program
 or speaker that focuses on online social etiquette. A program to show students the importance of thinking
 before they post and understanding the consequences of what they post online.
- PTG had a coffee cart for the teachers and staff on the 5th. As usual, everyone loved it.

In addition to updating the Nurse's office, this would also provide additional (much needed) storage for gym equipment in the and give the Phys Ed instructor an actual, usable office space. This would also allow the existing plumbing from the nurses office to be used to add a water bottle filling station to the gym.

The Stuff the Turkey food drive has been an incredible success. Donated items will go to the Bedford Community Food Bank.

The Memorial community has chosen 11 families for our annual Adopt-a-Family holiday/Christmas gift donation program. The response has been very positive and to-date, only a few items are the lists are outstanding.

Memorial 4th graders recorded a holiday greeting with the Bedford Fire Department which will air on BCTV throughout the holiday season.

Our 4th graders also participated in the annual Ellis Island event, and will be featured in an upcoming issue of the Bedford Journal and Bedford Bulletin.

Ms. Magoon has been busy preparing the Memorial 3rd and 4th grade chorus for the January concert. This year there are over 80 participants in the chorus program.
