Volunteer and organizing needs were discussed for several upcoming events including Spring Fling (3/29), Book Fair (4/8-4/12), Bingo Night (4/10), Small and Tall Dance (5/3).

Kid Vote results are in, and Aladdin Trouble was the winner, though voter turnout was low.

First graders are planning a field trip to the See Science Museum in Manchester, and will possibly use ORK funds to offset transportation costs. A benefit of attending the Museum is that students will get to participate in 4 separate educational programs throughout the day, if the museum staff came to the school, students would only get to experience 1 of the programs.

Year to date Kindergarten registration is continuing at a slower pace than last year. But due to the enrollment numbers of the current Kindergarten we are only about 11 new students shy of needing a 5th 1st grade teacher for the 2019-20 school year. We are also only 4 new students short of needing an additional 3rd grade teacher.

In response to PTG queries about the B&N event, some teachers who attended mentioned the lack of an on-site coordinator (either from the PTG or B&N) led to some confusion and disorganization.

Students are currently participating in a variety of Read Across America events, which will culminate in a presentation at the All School Meeting.

SAS testing, and Tripod Surveys are coming up soon. There will be a big push to have parents opt-in to the Tripod Survey in order to get more relevant demographic information. Next year we are hoping to include the opt-in process with registration material that must be completed online (via infosnap at the time of student enrollment).
