RBS:

We began the year with a delicious breakfast for staff. There was a good turnout for volunteer breakfast. We have over 130 volunteers. RBS gained a wonderful volunteer coordinator, Emily Tolsen. She has helped to fill a lot of roles at the school and we are excited for a new school year. 4th grade has begun to spend their ORK funds with some new authors to enhance their writing curriculum. Back to School Night was a large success with a huge turnout as always. We had a book fair that was a huge success.

PWS:

Overall, the start of the year was great. Volunteer numbers are up and many new faces are looking to join and head committees. Per Cheryl, Grade 4 is looking to have Carrie Cariello come in to do a session on creative writing. Cheryl and Dan have been going grade to grade discussing kindness and bullying with the classes, reading age-appropriate books with the class and engaging in discussions on how to spread kindness, etc. Parent pickup process has changed this year to ensure all IDs are checked daily until teachers become familiar with parents doing daily pickup. Process is going well. Finally, both PWS and PWS volunteers are looking to increase social media presence this year. PWS school page is highlighting classroom activities or staff members each week and volunteer page is looking to engage with Instagram to increase the interactions with parents/ families of students.

Enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year is down slightly below predicted levels, particularly for the Kindergarten class (after a substantially large bubble year in 2018-19).

Last year's large kindergarten class size has required the addition of a fifth 1st grade class. Cindy Zibel, who was hired as the additional K teacher last year, has been rehired to teach 1st grade.

The school is fully staffed, and all our teacher's aide and para professional positions have been filled.

The school, along with the district, will be focusing on establishing better communication standards for parent/school communications. Some of this will be accomplished by evaluating current terminology and adjusting to help eliminate confusing or similar terms, and to ensure consistent language is used across the entire school and professional learning community.

2020-2021 Budget season has begun, and Memorial will again be looking for funds to add a bathroom to the nurses office.

At the request of the coordinators, Memorial will be moving our annual Math and Literacy Night to from the fall to January this year.

Chorus has also begun, and has 85 (!!) students enrolled.

There has been a change to the strings program offered through Manchester School of Music, which will include a increase in fees for students enrolled in the program.

Our volunteers will be treating our teachers and staff to a Fall coffee cart on Oct 7th.

Marc is also proposing a Year Book for Memorial (which both RBS and PWS already offer).

We have unexpectedly lost both our Gift Wrap/Gift Card Coordinator and our It's a GAS coordinator. The volunteer team will fill in for Gift Wrap, and Kenn Archibald will step in at IAG until a new Coordinator can be recruited.

Our volunteer signups are down about 40% over last year, but our Support Drive donations are up 100%.
