BHS Liaison meeting with Bob Jozokos

Date: Mon October 4th, 1:45pm

Today was the first meeting with our new faculty liaison present. Sierra Dolce will be joining us for meetings and adding the teacher perspective. We explained our roles and reviewed the major PTG budget items and events at the high school.

Reviewed upcoming fundraisers and events for PTG. Bob will start sending Partners email to teachers as well. Right now he is just sending principal notes.

ORK and AIR - Bob has one ORK idea upcoming for red ribbon week - also an AIR artist visit which came up at the last minute so he did not get the form in ahead of time but I emailed both of these forms in for reimbursement. Bob says he understands if we are not able to reimburse for the AIR visit that he did not approve ahead of time.

Discussed having dinner for teacher conferences Thurs Oct 14 (set up by 3:30). Sierra was able to give her opinion that this would be the better day to do it as there are 2 days of conferences.

Bob asked about a scholarship for intersession -apparently PTG did this in 2019? They will be having intersession this year but no big trips, it will be 2 days instead of 3 and keeping in mind bus problems.

We discussed the Cookie Caper which is the next big event at the high school. This is usually in

December and we would typically have volunteers in the school and would get donations of cookies and pass out a cookie to every staff and student at the school. Bob said he wants to check to be sure when the Jewish holidays are so that most students will be in school, so we have not set a date yet.

We set our next meeting as Nov 9 at 1:45

October Lurgio PTG Update

- *Continuing to be mindful of physical distancing and cleaning efforts while watching cases.
- *Student Council representatives are brainstorming outdoor event options for students.
- *Music team is brainstorming options for outdoor winter performances.
- *Advisory is up and running. Each staff person meets with their standing group of about 12 students every other school day for 20 minutes. Recent work: team building, communication, calendar management, and how to reach out to your teachers. Some time on 10/12 Teacher Workshop day was used to share planning ideas.
- *Consideration for Priority Funds: communication boards in pod areas. Can be used to display highlighted information in high traffic areas. Reinforce school culture initiatives, promote clubs and their messages, etc.
- *After Mr Joyce highlighted the Lurgio PTG Volunteer google form in his Principal Notes, we've jumped from 58 to 83 entries.
- *We've had a great response for an ongoing library project to cover class sets of novels (85 hours). Also volunteers filled needs on multiple days for 8th grade Cardigan camping trips. Thank you to MCK PTG for extending an invitation to their volunteers to help out too!
- *Next project: planning a grab and go dinner for RAL staff during their extended Parent Teacher Conference night in early November.

- -2 new basketball hoops were to be installed yesterday (Oct. 12th), so hopefully that was able to happen. They are replacing old hoops, but it has taken a while to get them installed.
- -Phil would like to start a Town Council meeting to talk about getting a new piece of playground equipment to fill an existing spot. The money is already set aside, he would just like to get a vote from the community on what piece of equipment to buy. He is talking about getting this started at the end of Oct., beginning of Nov.
- -Memorial is really excited about winning the Blue Ribbon Award. Memorial is 1 of 325 schools selected for the award out of the entire Country, which is a great honor. Phil is going to go to DC in November to accept the award. Phil is planning other events to celebrate this throughout the year. He wants to have a school-wide celebration in the Spring. He also

mentioned blue ribbon cookies for the teachers.
