Memorial Liaison Update:

- -We have our next hot chocolate/ coffee cart Friday Feb. 11th.
- -Phil talked about the sprinklers at Memorial. Memorial doesn't have sprinklers in the building, only in the kitchen area which puts the school out of fire code compliance. This is up for a vote on the March 8th ballot.
- -Memorial just finished our NAEP national testing. 50, 4th grade students were randomly chosen for the testing.
- -3rd grade is having their Invention Convention on Feb 22nd and the 4th graders are having theirs on Feb. 24th which should be a lot of fun to see what they come up with.
- -Memorial decided to participate in Kindness week, it was a great success! The school counselor Ms. Hodgdon and a few teachers want to keep the spirit going with other activities through the rest of the year.
- -Cardio drumming started this week, this is a mix of Music and Physical Education. The kids

really enjoy this unit.

-Phil is trying to bring back the all school assembly once a month. He started this in Jan. where he recorded it and the teachers projected it on their white boards in the individual classrooms. This worked out well, so he is going to try to keep this going.

PWS Liaison Update:

Peter Woodbury School participated in Kindness week Jan 24-28. Students were given a challenge board to complete extra kindness activities throughout the week. The whole school was very excited to share their kindness during this special week.

As part of project based learning, the Third graders have been working on Native American podcasts and slideshows that showcase original music and information about various aspects of Native American tribes. Staff were invited to listen and view the presentations. The PWS staff are also working to build more lessons and training around project base learning activities.

Third grade has also been working hard during their Inventive Thinking unit which will wrap up the final week of February. ORK funds have been utilized to bring in speaker and presenter Zack Umperovitch. Zack is an expert in design, construction, testing and judging chain reaction machines (also known to the students as a Rube Goldberg). PWS was also award grant money from the Bedford Kids First grant to purchase gym size simple machine pieces to use during the Inventive Thinking units for 3rd and 4th graders.

Chorus has resumed for the fourth grade students. Their last concert was held virtual.
