The current budget did not account for police details. Also meal for principals was donated last year and this year that is not the case. Discussed with board that the event is expected to run about \$50 over budget.

Board discussed ways to help with the spending by possibly creating a sign up genius so parents could help supply snacks and water for the students attending.

Next years' budget will need to be increased to cover the turn costs.

RSVPs are running about ½ as what the event had last time it was done in person.

This event was well attended. Overall feedback was positive.

• Scarlett Lewis - Choose Love

February 23rd date has just been confirmed with BHS theater. Discussed how to start promoting the event now...Save the date posts; Ask Tejal to draft something and share with Molly for all schools to put on their FB pages.

Media Power Youth

Several options for in person technology/media presentations and programming. Options like how to navigate apps usage; creating a family media contract; to student workshops. Costs are very reasonable. Sessions can be tailored to K-5 and 6-12 grade levels. This will be pursued for likely spring time.

**Kevin Hines** Suicide Prevention Speaker - contact has been made with Kevin's booking contact. He has availability in the fall. Discussed funding options. Possibly present at BHS for students (this is being pursued with Bob) and evening presentation for families. Plans will continue to move forward to bring this to fruition.

GRANDFRIENDS DAY: Dates tbd by each individual school.

• Liaisons should be starting to think about reaching out to coordinators about this now. Discussed how best practices could be shared. Suggested encouraging the GFD coordinators at each school to meet to review what they do.

SURPLUS UPDATE Current Surplus is - \$22,212

\*\* New Option \*\* Already installed Cameras/Alarm at BHS \$6,603.91

This amount has already been paid by the SAU but have asked if PTG would consider reimbursing them.

- BHS Theater lights \$5.5K In proposed operating budget for March
- Vision screener \$3.6K In proposed operating budget for March
- Evacuation backpacks approx \$2K

AED's: \$917/each, (so x8=\$7,336 and x6=\$5,502)

Initial counts: BHS - 2 Commons and Gym, RAL- 1 Cafe. MIS - 2 Cafe and Gym, RBS 1,

PWS 1 - Cafe, MEM -1 Cafe

Follow up - Is grant money available for AEDs?

Combination options for spending:

- AED only = \$7,336 (14.7K remains in budget)
- AED+Door Camera/Alarm = \$13,939 (\$8,061)
- AED+Door Camera/Alarm+Evac Backpacks= 15,939 (6,061)
- Remaining money could be put towards
  - Funding for Mental Health programming/training including things like drug/alcohol awareness, suicide prevention, sexual/dating violence prevention etc. amount TBD (proposal would be to use whatever monies remain after some of the above listed combination of options is chosen, see amount in parentheses).
  - Or held over for next year in the event that the operating budget doesn't pass at which point in the fall we could cover the 2 additional items with the remaining funds combined with next year's projected surplus.

The board voted to fund AED needs (final # confirmation needed from Mike), Evacuation backpacks (need quote) and to reimburse the district for the Cameras/Alarms already installed at BHS (paperwork needed to show what was paid out by BSD). Expected total to be approximately \$16,000. Memo will be drafted to the district to outline the specific usage for these funds. Intent is to cut a single check to the school district for all of these items.
