BHS

- Graduation seats - BHS is supportive of BHS PTG raffling off graduation seats. The goal is to have this information available well in advance of graduation.
- BHS wants to make sure that no other Bedford schools are raffling graduation tickets. This has caused some complications in the past, they would like this raffle to be handled by BHS PTG.
- This could start any time we'd like (January through February)
- BHS will give us 4 seats in the front row. We can choose the seats (excluding 8 seats that are taken by BHS Junior class raffle)
- PTG board will pick the seats

- Graduation parking spot raffle - BHS will be providing PTG with 1 parking spot to raffle

- Support for PTG seats/parking spot - BHS recommends that we have people to “guard” the seats and parking spot on the day of graduation.
- Parking spot raffle - We’d like to start this process earlier so no conflict with BHS/Town lottery. Families/students would know if they have a PTG spot prior to the need to register for the BHS or Town of Bedford parking lottery.
- Potential timing for PTG approval:

- Collect entries in April & drawing in May
- BHS parking doesn’t begin until after Memorial Day
- Cookie Caper - December 18th PTG will have the Cookie Caper at BHS. Donation information will be sent out at the end of November or beginning of December.
- Provide PTG promotional items for students?
- BHS Craft Fair - Sunday November 9th 10am-2pm - PTG had a table at the BHS craft fair. It was great to see all the artisans, especially the students and staff who participated in the craft fair.
- PTG website redesign - BHS has students who participate in programming/computer courses. Teachers could help identify students who could help with the PTG website.
- Cell phone ban & Kelly Ayotte visit - Cell phone ban continues to be going well in classrooms but students are trying to use their phones more in areas like Bulldog Corner or the Commons. Kelly Ayotte met with a group of students and staff when she visited BHS last Wednesday.
